Arthur Lesow Community Center Expansion Grand Opening & Ribbon Cutting Held on June 1st

The City of Monroe invited residents, community partners, and local stakeholders to celebrate the official Grand Opening of the expansion of the Arthur Lesow Community Center — a new community hub designed to connect residents with educational resources, workforce development opportunities, library services, and collaborative community spaces.

The Grand Opening was held on June 1, 2026, and included remarks by City officials and Center partners, a ribbon cutting ceremony, and guided opportunities to explore the facility. The new 28,000-square-foot facility has been several years in the making, with planning dating back to 2019. A majority of the funding for the \$9.3 million project came from the state; the City of Monroe contributed \$2 million.

Located at 120 Eastchester Street, in the heart of Monroe's Orchard East neighborhood, the expanded Center now serves as home to the new Lillian Stewart Navarre Branch Library, The Learning Bank, and the Monroe County Opportunity Center, creating a shared environment centered around community-focused services and programming.

This project represents a major community investment focused on collaboration, lifelong learning, and neighborhood revitalization and brings together multiple services under one roof to support learning, creativity, opportunity, and community engagement for residents of all ages.

The expanded Arthur Lesow Community Center is the new home of the Monroe County Learning Bank Network. **Kim Gluski**, Director of the Learning Bank, was one of the speakers at the Grand Opening, and she and Superintendent **Andrew Shaw** were among those invited to be part of the Ribbon Cutting ceremony.

Special guests and Community Center partners gathered behind Mayor **Robert Clark**, who used a pair of oversized ceremonial scissors to cut the ribbon, symbolizing the opening of the expanded Center.

Remarks from Superintendent Andrew Shaw

Superintendent **Andrew Shaw** shared four ideas that have the power to change lives — HOPE, CURIOSITY, BELIEF, and ATTITUDE.



"Hope gives us the courage to take the next step even when we can't see the entire journey."

He shared wisdom from TV character Ted Lasso: 'Be curious, not judgmental... Curiosity invites us to ask questions instead. It encourages us to listen before we speak, and to understand before we decide.'

"Belief is the foundation of achievement. Before any goal can be accomplished, we must first believe it is possible... Our attitude influences how we see opportunities, how we treat others, and how we handle setbacks. When hope, curiosity, belief, and attitude come together, the remarkable can happen."

"Hope helps us see what could be. Curiosity helps us understand others and the world around us. Belief gives us the confidence to act, and attitude ties them all together. Together, they inspire us to grow, to connect, and to make a difference... As you move into your next step of life, I encourage you to hold onto hope, choose curiosity over judgment, believe in yourself and those around you, and know that attitude makes a difference."



Amanda Althouse

Amanda Althouse is the Director of Student Success at Monroe County Community College.

She has been a strong supporter of adult education students and has helped connect graduates with opportunities for college, career training, and continuing education. Before joining MCCC, she spent a decade at Orchard Center High School.

"You can and you will."

"Each of you arrived here by a different path. Some of you completed your GED, high school completion, high school equivalency... Your journeys have been anything but identical, but that's exactly what makes this accomplishment so meaningful."

"For many people, education follows a straight line. For others, life has a way of creating detours. Responsibilities at home, work obligations, finances, health concerns, family circumstances, and unexpected setbacks can change the course of one person's plan. What matters is not how many times that path has changed. What matters is that you kept moving forward. Today is proof that persistence is more powerful than obstacles. There were days it would have been easy to quit, days when the finish line seemed too far away, or you questioned whether you could do it, but here you are. You showed up, you put in the work, you chose not to let your circumstances define you, and that's something that no diploma will ever be able to fully measure. This achievement represents more than completing coursework and passing exams. It's resilience, courage, and the willingness to invest in yourself even when the outcome was uncertain."

"I hope you remember that no matter what obstacle presents itself, no matter how impossible a task might seem, and no matter how many times you might hear or think you can't, you can and you will... Success is not about where you start, but the determination to keep moving forward."

Jacob Wilson

"Every student here tonight has their own story. We have taken different paths to get here, but we all share something in common — we persevered."

Jacob Wilson thanked the staff at the Monroe County Learning Bank and Monroe Public Schools. "You welcomed us with patience, encouraged us when we were struggling, and always celebrated our success, no matter how big or small. You saw the possibilities in us even when we sometimes had trouble seeing it ourselves."

"This experience has taught me a valuable lesson — that we are all capable of more than we think. My hope is that each one of us leaves here tonight with confidence, a sense of purpose, and gratitude. Let us all continue to learn and to grow."



Graduate Speaker

Kaitlyn Lake

After her GED, Kaitlyn enrolled at MCCC. Last May, she finished the winter semester with a 4.0 GPA. In November, the Learning Bank offered her a job.

Kaitlyn experienced abuse, abandonment, loss, homelessness, and heartbreak. "I grew up in chaos and a home where love didn't always look like love, and safety was never guaranteed... I learned how to survive," she said, "but surviving and living are two very different things."

"The people here — the staff, the teachers, and even other students — gave me what I needed most: belief. They didn't see me as broken or lost; they saw someone still fighting. The Learning Bank gave me structure, understanding and stability, but most importantly, it gave me hope."



Graduate Speaker

Jennifer Victory

Kim Gluski shared that Jennifer's accomplishment is even more special, because her twins, Chloe and Christopher, are also graduates of the Class of 2026!

Jennifer started with the Learning Bank in 2011/12 when her kids were at Early Head Start and she heard about the program from the ISD. The success she started to achieve was sadly stifled by an abusive marriage.

"Working job to job and hours upon hours," she struggled. In 2020, she met and married her soulmate. He knew she was "meant to do bigger and better things in life," and with his support, she called the Learning Bank again. "When I called, I was in complete surprise that the people that once helped me start my journey would watch me cross the finish line once and for all," she shared.

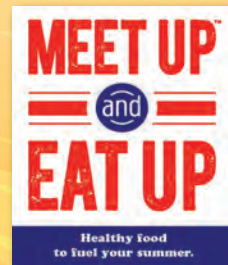

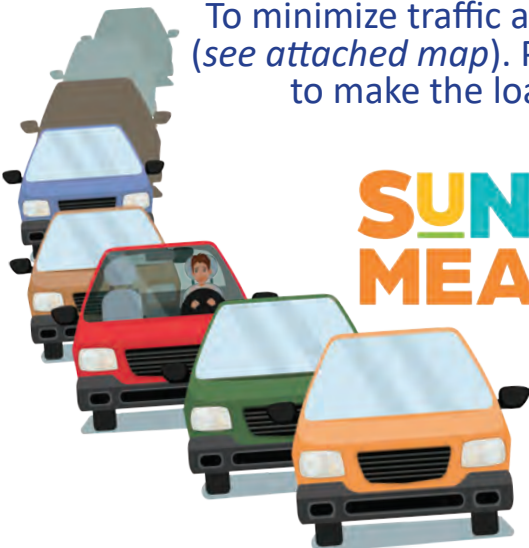

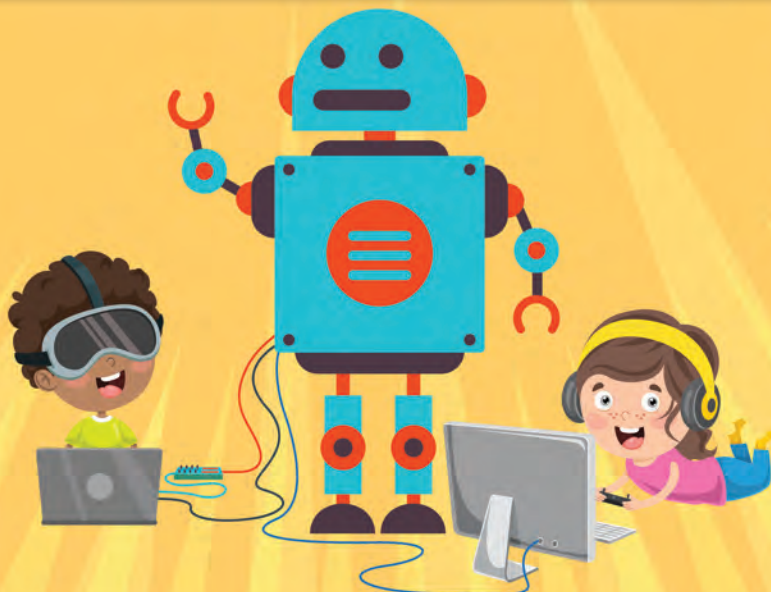
