While we take a step back in time, we're also taking a step forward. For the first time in our Winterfest history, the festivities will build up to a girls' basketball game on Friday night with the dance on Saturday from 7 to 10:00 pm.

#### Dance - Dress Code:

Students will dress with respect for themselves and others. Homecoming, Winterfest and Prom are meant to be formal occasions so students are asked to wear their finest. The dance dress code includes no visible undergarments, dresses will be no shorter than mid-thigh, and two piece dresses are acceptable if no midriff exposure. If a student chooses to arrive at the dance in violation of the dress code, they will not be allowed to enter and will be given a refund the week following the dance.

#### Dance - Protocol (Revised)

The Senior Student Leadership Team and administration want all students to have an enjoyable time at the dances. They are asking the students to be mindful of what is appropriate and self-correct or let a peer know if dancing crosses the line into inappropriate. The sponsors for the dances line up chaperone faculty members who will remind students, as needed, to dance appropriately. Because it is a school dance, the music will be radio version.

Dances, other than prom, which are sponsored by the various classes and other clubs, shall be open to all Monroe High School students. Monroe High students may bring high school students from area high schools if they meet the approval standards by their home school and the sponsoring MHS student registers them in the Assistant Principals' office prior to the dance. Non-registered visitors will not be allowed. All students must arrive with their ID and ticket. Students will not be admitted to any dance later than one hour after the official start time.
